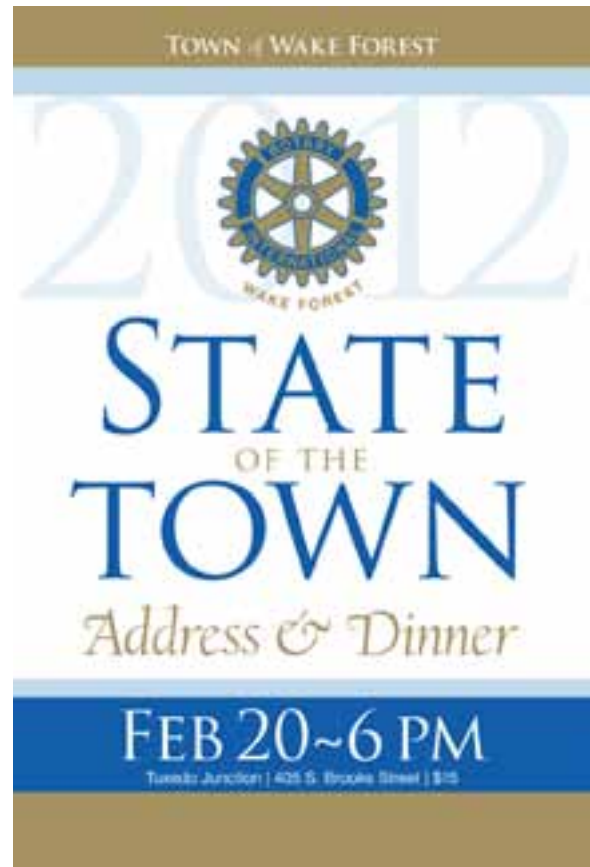

Green Medal Award Nominations

The Wake Forest Urban Forestry Board is requesting nominations for the 2012 Green Medal Awards of Excellence. The Green Medal Awards recognize individuals, groups and businesses that promote good environmental stewardship and excellence in service, while demonstrating an unwavering commitment to the enhancement of Wake Forest's urban forest.

The Town of Wake Forest has been designated as a Tree City USA for the past 32 years. This distinction is the result of the invaluable efforts of local volunteers and groups that assist with Urban Forestry Board projects aimed at improving the environment and the community. The 2012 Green Medal Awards will recognize these individuals and groups that have been instrumental in local tree issues and projects. Awards will be presented in the following categories:

Civic - Awarded to an individual, civic club or organization that has shown outstanding service, education, tree planting or other volunteer-based work. Participation in an Urban Forestry Board-sponsored event is encouraged, but should not be the only example of service.

Corporate - Awarded to a company or business which exhibits a pattern of commitment to the environment, or which has made a significant contribution to the urban forest through an internal education program, a self-initiated tree planting or other outreach project.

Program or Project - Designed to honor a program or project which promotes good urban forestry or environmental practice, or to a development which has shown excellence in tree preservation or landscaping. Only those developments which exceed town requirements or meet them by using particularly creative methods such as innovative planting or design will be considered.

Community Forester - This award is intended to honor a lifetime or career of excellence in urban forestry or leadership in environmental integrity

and practice. The recipient's service should be demonstrated as having a significant impact on the community.

Green Medal Award nomination forms are available online on the Urban Forestry Board website located at www.wakeforestnc.gov/government/urbanforestryboard.aspx and at the Wake Forest Town Hall, 301 S. Brooks St.

Green Medal Award nominations may be mailed to Evan Keto, Town of Wake Forest, 301 S. Brooks St., Wake Forest, NC 27587; faxed to (919) 435-9499; or emailed to eketo@wakeforestnc.gov. Completed nominations must be received no later than 5 p.m. Monday, Feb. 6, 2012.

Green Medal Award recipients will be recognized at the Annual Arbor Day Celebration scheduled for Thursday, March 15, 2012.

Upcoming Unified Development Ordinance Public Workshops

The town is planning to have three “public workshop/meetings” on March 1st in the ground floor training room of Town Hall to update everyone on where we are in the process of drafting our UDO. The first meeting will be at 10:00 AM, second at 12:30 PM & third at 6:30 PM.

Ever wonder why things get built like they do, especially if they don't seem to look or function like you think they should? In most communities, don't blame the developers – it's usually the fault of some deficiency in the development rules themselves. In Wake Forest, the Town has long struggled with development rules, known as the Unified Development Ordinance (UDO), that are outdated, confusing, and oftentimes contrary to the vision of the community. In fact, everything that has been built in the past 30 years – for good or for bad - has used a rulebook specifying, often to great lengths, the elements required for each new building, parking lot, and subdivision.

The comprehensive overhaul of the Town's Development Ordinances currently underway represents one of the key implementing strategies towards fulfilling the vision of the 2010 Community Plan. It will establish a new rulebook that will encourage walkable, mixed-use development; beautiful tree-lined neighborhood streets; a vibrant downtown; attractive shopping areas; and

open space that is valued, protected, useable and accessible. In addition, the new UDO will clarify the development process for everyone involved – developers, contractors, builders, tenants, and homeowners – ensuring a more predictable climate for growth and change.

The UDO is been prepared to make everything easy to find, including graphics, tables, and images to help clarify the rules and expectations. There will be a simplified use table, new standards for architectural design, enhanced requirements for the dedication of public open space, and clear supplemental use requirements that will reduce the reliance on unpredictable Special Use Permits and other laborious permit processes that have previously left both developers and neighbors frustrated. Landscaping standards will protect the town's tree canopy and ensure the planting of the next generation of trees. And finally, the new requirements will encourage energy efficient design and environmentally sustainable neighborhoods and development.

The UDO requirements will establish a new set of rules that will raise the expectations for developers and assist in fulfilling the community's vision. It is hoped that these new rules will help to forge a more pedestrian-friendly, mixed-use, and sustainable future for the Town of Wake Forest.
